We are looking to reward unrecognised commitment, determination and potential.

Nominations are welcomed in support of those people or organisations you feel have made, or show the potential for making, a real contribution to helping improve the lives of offenders, victims, families and communities.

We invite nominations by and for individuals and organisations working within the criminal justice field, including charities and community groups, prisons, probation and police.

This year we will be making two awards; one for an outstanding individual contribution and one for an outstanding organisational contribution.



The nomination process

Nomination is a simple process: contact us to request a nomination form for either an individual or organisation. You will be sent a questionnaire asking for more detail about the work of the individual or organisation you are nominating.

Nomination forms will need to be completed by 3 November 2009.

After the closing date all entries are sent to the judging panel for scoring, the panel will then meet in December to decide on the winners. Winners will be announced shortly after this meeting. The winner in each category will be awarded a cash sum of £500 along with formal recognition of their work on our website.
